Locations: The Youth Club on Wheels is based at our BS14 Youth Centre, Stockwood Lane, Stockwood, BS14 8SJ

There may be requirement as the charity needs to work at other locations with prior notice

Expenses: Work related expenses will be reimbursed, subject to receipts being produced, along with work related mileage in line with YB agreed payment rates.

Hours: 18 hours a week Wednesday, Thursday, Friday 14:30 – 20:30, evening sessional work.

The Role

The Youth Club on Wheels project is like no other project and is well established. We develop and engage young people on their own turf and work really hard doing so. We work with the hardest to reach young people and create amazing relationships and provide opportunities that empower and enrich communities who do not have any other provision for Young People.

The YCOW Youth leader will work on our unique mobile provision to deliver engaging, educational and energising programmes to young people. They will work to deliver the best opportunities for young people, broadening their horizons and supporting them to become successful, resilient and confident members of their communities. The post holder will act as a role model for young people, encompassing the values of Young Bristol and help young people make positive choices.

The role will help plan programmes, involving youth voice to ensure young people's views and thoughts and interests are heard so the clubs work for them.



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Person Specification

- A person who engages with young people easily and genuinely cares about them.
- A person who has an interest in the YCOW and strong desire to ensure that it is well looked after.
- A person who is physically capable of moving equipment, and accessing vehicles for resourcing in line with manual handling policy & procedures
- A person who approaches work with a positive attitude, willing be flexible to meet the needs of young people
- A person who acts with integrity and empathises with others.
- A person who works well in a team – able to both lead and support as necessary
- Able to provide members with appropriate information, advice, support and challenge and refer them to specialist help when required.
- Able to establish and maintain positive, professional relationships with members, including agreeing limits of acceptable behaviour.
- Ability to use a variety of approaches to engage members and ensure their voice is heard and where appropriate and possible acted upon.
- Commitment to equalities and anti-discriminatory working practice.
- Prepared to work evening and occasional weekends with notice.
- All YCOW staff and volunteers have enhanced DBS disclosures and work within strict safeguarding guidelines.



Experience

Essential

- Have held a valid driving license for minimum of 2 years, (this is a requirement of driving charity vehicles)
- Passionate, and committed to developing young people socially, emotionally and personally.
- If not already qualified, fully commit to completing the Level 3 Youth Work qualification including attendance at training sessions and fulfilling evidence gathering administration. This course would be funded by Young Bristol as part of your CPD offer.
- A willingness, commitment and desire to learn is imperative as experience and training can be delivered.
- Experience of face-to-face work with young people in a paid or voluntary capacity
- Good organisational skills – including communicating with suppliers etc. for ensuring equipment are professionally maintained.



Experience

Desirable

- Experience driving larger vehicles e.g minibuses. The YCOW can be driven on a normal car license.
- National qualification in Youth Work Practice or linked qualifications
- Experience of detached and/or mobile youth work
- Knowledge of Health and Safety management.
- Knowledge of Safeguarding children and young people
- A desire to keep abreast of developments in the sector.
- An understanding of or interest in discovering the issues affecting children and young people.



Key Responsibilities

- Drive the Youth Club on Wheels and other mobile equipment to and from base of operations to youth work delivery locations.
- Ensure YCOW equipment is well maintained and ready for regular youth work sessions.
- Ensure YCOW youth work resources are stocked, checked and ready for use.
- Build and nurture positive and supportive relationships with young people helping to increase their confidence, skills, aspirations and opportunities.
- Deliver evening youth work provision and support the planning and organising of appropriate and relevant programmes that are member led.
- To promote and encourage member participation, decision making and responsibility amongst the membership.
- To develop understanding of key needs and priorities of members and form appropriate professional relationships with members.



Key Responsibilities cont

- To deliver support, advice and guidance using best practice in such areas as sexual health, drugs/alcohol, C- card, Health and Well-Being etc.
- To attend staff meetings and training sessions as deemed necessary by the YCOW lead.
- To take positive steps to counter discrimination, however and wherever it occurs.
- To assist with organising, coordinating and supervising fundraising activities of the YCOW.
- To assist the working towards acquiring Quality Assurance Accreditation.
- To carry out such other duties as may be requested by the Youth Club on Wheels Lead
- Work within all YCOW policies and procedures e.g. health and safety, safeguarding etc
